Along with her husband David, Mira Sadker has spoken in more than forty states and abroad, giving hundreds of presentations and seminars to teachers and parents concerned about the negative impact of sexist behavior. She has written numerous articles on how to educate and teach children free from the debilitating effects of sexism. On her behalf, Mira Sadker Advocates was created to continue its efforts and create a fairer and more efficient school.
